

Analysis of the long-term impacts associated with traffic and air quality indicate that roadway changes associated with the Project would improve traffic congestion conditions within the project area, resulting in an anticipated reduction of vehicle operational emissions and a resulting improvement in both localized and regional air quality conditions. Additionally, roadway improvements associated with the Project will take place within the Middlesex College campus and therefore away from residential properties. As a result, existing and future noise impacts are not expected to impact project area residential communities. As such, disproportionately high and adverse impacts associated with Proposed Project on minority and low-income and minority populations are not expected.

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Explain: Access to the site would not be limited as a result of the Project. Access for ceremonial use of Indian sacred sites by Indian religious practitioners would remain completely accessible, as it is presently. Additionally, construction of the Project would not disrupt the physical integrity of the site any greater than construction of the former Raritan Arsenal and existing Thomas A. Edson Park facilities. As such, the Project would not significantly adversely affect the physical integrity of Indian sacred sites. **Tribal consultation could support this statement**

Temporarily disturbed areas would be reseeded with native species in accordance with an approved Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Plan from the Freehold Soil Conservation District. As no invasive species would be introduced to the site as a result of the Project, no adverse impacts are anticipated.
